We will schedule a brief interview with you at a mutually convenient time after we have received your application. If you are accepted into the training program and offered a slot in the next training, we will provide you with a volunteer contract, and ask you to sign it and return it to us. The contract will signify your commitment to us including the following:



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Mediators are required to attend a 50-hour training, without missing any classroom sessions, in order to qualify for a training certificate. The training is followed by an apprenticeship consisting of two mediation observations, two co-mediations with an experienced mediator, and an evaluation/strategy session. After successful completion of an apprenticeship, new mediators are invited to join the CRC roster of mediators serving Baltimore County.

Mediators are required to volunteer 50 hours of service over the course of the first year after their training and 24 hours of service for second and subsequent years. Mediators are also required to attend periodic in-service training.

Volunteer hours need not be contributed only in mediation services, but in other volunteer services as well, such as public outreach or committee work for the organization – we are in great need of that now. We will work with you to coordinate your commitment and your schedule.
